

USE OF COOKIES

What are cookies?

The Mészáros Group website uses cookies during its operation.

A cookie (also known as an HTTP cookie or simply a cookie) is a small packet of information created by the web server, sent to the browser, and returned by the browser with every subsequent request to the server. The cookie is stored in a separate directory on the browser, typically in text format. Cookies are now universally recognized and handled by virtually all browsers.

A cookie can store any kind of data, usually in the form of name-value pairs.

What are cookies used for?

Cookies are primarily used to store the results of user activities (such as logging in, clicking, accepting or rejecting conditions, etc.) on the web server running the website, so that this information can be reused later. They allow the website (in this case, the Mészáros Group's website) to "remember" that the user has visited the site before. This technology serves as the foundation for all modern web services.

On the Mészáros Group website, cookies are used solely to enhance the user experience, applied during the session, but no specific data is recorded during the visit. The cookies used on the website are deleted from our system when the user exits the site.

When you open the website, you can choose to accept or reject cookies. If you do not accept the use of cookies, the website will still be accessible, but certain services will be limited, as accepting cookies is required to access all services.

What is the purpose of using cookies, and what is the legal basis for their use?

The purpose of using cookies is to ensure the proper functioning of the website, and the legal basis for their use is set forth in Section 13/A (3) of Act CVIII of 2001.
